




Asian Americans in Action (A3)

- Advocacy efforts to address anti-Asian hate










Ethnicity of Respondents N= 66



Impacts of Anti-Asian Hate in OC

- Fear of going out in public
- School bullying
- Vandalism (at homes and businesses)
- Threatening phone calls at Asian American community-serving orgs
- Assault at COVID vaccination site run by an Asian American clinic
- Physical attacks



Importance of community input

- Affected communities should be at the center of the solution
- Community members go to trusted sources (non-profit organizations, places of worship, etc.) for assistance after a hate crime or incident
- CBOs provide victim assistance services (mental health assistance, rapid response, cultural navigation)
- Engagement from all BIPOC communities is needed to address racism and white supremacy at a structural and systemic level
