The Anti-Defamation League (ADL) Orange County/Long Beach, and Women for American Values and Ethics (WAVE) condemn hateful rhetoric directed at Anaheim Mayor Ashleigh Aitken.

Anaheim, CA – Prominent Southern
California advocates for civil and human
rights announce their unified support for
Mayor Ashleigh Aitken of Anaheim for her
courage in publicly inviting an LGBTQ+
Community Service Organization to Pride
Night at the Los Angeles Angels game in
Anaheim on June 7.

Aitken invited the Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence to Anaheim after the Los Angeles Dodgers rescinded their Pride Night invitation to the group. The Dodgers have since re-invited the group. Civil and human rights groups supporting Aitken include The Anti-Defamation League of Orange County/Long Beach, community leader and human rights worker, Michael Sean Wright and Women for American Values and Ethics (WAVE).

"We are concerned with the level of hateful messages aimed at Mayor Aitken following her support of LGBTQ+ attendance at Angels Pride Night at Anaheim Stadium. As we all know, the rising rhetoric particularly against the LGBTQ+ community now by extremists normalizes hate that all too often harms marginalized groups. We stand in solidarity with the LGBTQ+ community and do not waver in supporting their civil liberties in all spaces," said Peter Levi, Regional Director of the ADL Orange County/Long Beach.

"We join together with the ADL Orange County/Long Beach in condemning the troubling and vitriolic online harassment of Mayor Aitken," said Michael Sean Wright, Founder of the Medical Relief Agency. WoundWalk.org . "We know what it feels like to have targets placed on us by a growing number of far-right nationalists. They have never been shy or masked their hatred for the queer community here, but now feel even more emboldened to focus on harassing an already marginalized community. We also see in Orange County, California, the direct effects of the increase in targeted attacks on our trans community nationwide. What Mayor Aitken did with her invitation was an offer of inclusion; her reward by some is to threaten her because they feel threatened somehow?" Wright said.

"WAVE fully supports Mayor Ashleigh Aitken – she is courageous and forward-thinking, and is not afraid to demonstrate inclusion, equality, and openness in how she leads," said Ali Monge, executive director of WAVE.
