Date: December 11, 2018

Goals:

To strengthen relationships between the Tustin community and the Tustin Police Department

• Have a better understanding of Tustin PD's role relating to ICE in the community

Resources:

- Pizza, cookies and water
- PowerPoint presentation
- Index cards for participant Q&A

Attendance:

- 24 parents, 10 children and youth
- Approximately 12 Tustin PD officers
- 2 Behind the Badge Reporters

Results:

- Residents were made aware of crime statistics, California Senate Bill 24 and instances where Tustin PD may assist ICE
- Tustin PD shared about their community activities and programs: "Run with a Cop", "Turkey Bowl", "Spanish Language Citizens' Academy", "Santa Cop"
- Residents and children shared their enjoyment with these past activities and were interested in participating in future community events
- OCHRC Staff presented on the partnership with Tustin PD on the Youth and Parent Dialogues
- OCHRC shared on Police Community Reconciliation Program

Future Recommendations:

- Taking the Town Hall Meeting to different schools in all sections of city of Tustin
- Suggest school representatives be present to demonstrate visible support
- More school support in promoting Town Hall meeting through parent liaison
- Choosing a different month for Town Hall meeting given that the Latino community celebrates the Virgen de Guadalupe in the first weeks of December, which has an impact on attendance.
