
# **Hate-Motivated Activities in Orange County**








17 Total Hate-Motivated Activities Reported

## OC HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION DENOUNCES ALL TYPE OF BIAS-MOTIVATED HATE

Santa Ana, CA (October 12, 2023) The Orange County Human Relations Commission celebrates Pride month with our Orange County LGBTQ+ community in June and stands with the LGBTQ+ community every other month of the year. We believe this vibrant and inclusive movement is to be commended. With each passing year, we are reminded that we still have work to do to ensure that every Orange County resident can live authentically and without threat of harm.

Across Orange County, from 2021 to 2022, there was a 126% increase in Anti-LGBTQ hate activity reported. In addition, hate crimes motivated by sexual orientation increased by 24% and hate incidents motivated by sexual orientation increased by 161%.

The mission of the Orange County Human Relations Commission is to "seek out the causes of tension and conflict, discrimination and intolerance and attempt to eliminate those causes." We believe in everyone's right to live free of racism, hate, discrimination, and bigotry no matter where you live. We are committed to fight racism and bigotry with love, empathy, compassion, and strength while promoting equity, inclusion, diversity and belonging for all.

## OC HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION MOURNS WITH JEWISH **COMMUNITY AND DENOUNCES ANTISEMITISM**

Santa Ana, CA (11/9/23) The Orange County Human Relations Commission unequivocally condemns and denounces the horrific acts of terror including murder, rape, and kidnapping committed against Israeli civilians on October 7, 2023 by Hamas. Entire families were taken hostage by Hamas just days after Israel marked the holiest days on the Jewish calendar, killing 1400.

This single greatest attack on Jews since the Holocaust came just after this commission's 2022 Orange County Hate Crime Report revealed that Jewish residents of Orange County continue to be the primary target of faith-based hate incidents (87%). This hateful attack sparked a dramatic increase in antisemitism in the United States, resulting in our Orange County Jewish community experiencing harassment and fear of violence where they live, work, pray, and go to school. As Elie Wiesel said, "For the dead and the living, we must bear witness."

We offer our deepest sympathies and condolences to the Jewish community who have been affected by the horrendous events of October 7th. We are resolute and unwavering in our stance against hate, and we stand committed to fighting antisemitism in Orange County. We urge all Orange County residents to treat our Jewish neighbors with respect and continue to hope for an Orange County where fear and violence yield to understanding and coexistence for all its residents.

### OC HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION MOURNS WITH PALESTINIAN-AMERICANS AND DENOUNCES ISLAMOPHOBIA

Santa Ana, CA (11/9/23) The Palestinian struggle for land and home is generations-long. Now as a result of the Israeli response to Hamas' terrorist attack, more than one million Palestinians have been displaced, and an additional two million are expected to be displaced and their homes destroyed with nowhere to go and limited humanitarian aid. Thousands of Palestinians have been massacred, nearly half children. They have taken their last breath under concrete rubble, and many more are still longing to breathe free.

In Orange County we offer our deepest and most heartfelt condolences to our Palestinian neighbors for the tragic loss of life and ongoing violence in their homeland. We condemn the horrific hate crime and murder of a six-year-old Palestinian-American boy, Wades Al Fayouma, and the stabbing of his mother. As our Muslim, Palestinian-American and Arab-American communities in Orange County are grieving, we reiterate that they should not have to live in fear of harassment, discrimination, or hate anywhere.

The Orange County Human Relations Commission strongly condemns the increase in hate incidents against Muslim, Palestinian-American, and Arab-Americans. We are resolute that Arab and Muslim Orange County residents must not be harassed and held responsible for the acts of Hamas, but together we must combat the false narrative that Arabs and Muslims are terrorists.

We are resolute and unwavering in our stance against hate and stand committed to fighting Islamophobia in Orange County. We urge all Orange County residents to treat our Muslim, Palestinian-American and Arab-
